RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE LEADER OF THE PARTY

Each party must be accompanied by a leader travelling on a valid individual passport who will be responsible for the party during the various frontier formalities, including customs, immigration and currency controls, for keeping the party together and for retaining the collective travel document.

All persons named in the collective document must travel together to and from their destination and must remain together during their stay.

In the event of a member of the party travelling on a collective travel document for young persons becoming separated from the party or being unable to travel back to his country of residence with the rest of the party for reasons beyond his control, the leader of the party must inform the local authorities and if possible the nearest British Consul. He must

in any case inform the frontier authorities of the absence of any member of his party at the time of its departure. Any person not leaving with his party must, if required, obtain an individual travel document from the British consular authorities.

Collective travel documents for young persons shall be issued in original to the leader of the party, who should provide himself with as many copies as may be required for presentation at the frontier posts of the countries to be visited.

Each member over 16 years of age of a party travelling on a collective passport for young persons must be in possession of an individual identity document bearing a photograph and the official stamp of the Foreign Office.

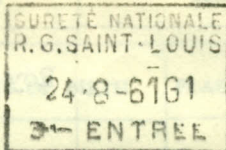

RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE LEADER OF THE PARTY
