

Editorial

OVER four years have passed since the last *Visor* appeared; four years of great changes and of bitter warfare the world over. Our own Roll of Honour is a sad proof of this. Speech Day, 21st June, 1943

THE proceedings opened with the School singing "Song of Creation," which was followed by the Address by the Worshipful the Mayor, Alderman J. H. Hodgkinson, who presided. Following the Mayor's address the third and fourth forms gave a stirring rendering of "England," after which the Chairman of the Governors, Councillor J. Furness, addressed the assembly, saying that he hoped that parents would keep their sons and daughters in the secondary schools as long as possible. He went on to say that it might have been assumed that the standard of education would have fallen, owing to the difficult times Birkenhead had passed through, but it was very gratifying to see the successes the boys of the Institute had gained.

Mr. Wynne Hughes, the Headmaster, then gave his report on the work of the School during the several years which had passed since the previous Speech Day. He was very grieved to report that Alderman G. A. Solly, the Chairman of the Governors, and a grand friend of the School, had passed away. Mr. Solly's mantle had fallen on the shoulders of Mr. Furness, and the Headmaster was happy to welcome him on behalf of the School.

Mr. Hughes then thanked the Staff for the help they had given him in organising school dinners, and he paid tribute to Miss Bowers who had retired after 28 years' service in the Junior School. He regretted that one of the sad casualties of the war was the closing of the Junior School. Referring to the war savings effort in the School, the Headmaster said that the savings group had done magnificently during the "War Weapons" and "Wings" weeks, and since the group had been started some nineteen years before by Mr. Hall, it had saved almost £8,000.

Following the report, the School sang the hymn "Worship," and then Professor Henry Cohen, an Old Boy of the School, addressed the assembly, and recalled how he had spent his early days at the Institute. He recalled that the first time he ever appeared on the stage at the Town Hall was in a Shakespearean play. Professor Cohen then presented the prizes to the boys who had earned them since the last Speech Day.

The Vote of Thanks was then proposed, and the assembly broke up after singing the National Anthem.

Alderman G. A. Solly

THE School suffered a great loss in the death of the Chairman of its Governors, Alderman Solly, on February 12th, 1941. A Cheshire man, Mr. Solly was born at Congleton, and educated at Rugby, and followed the profession of Solicitor. He was closely associated with the public life and administration of Birkenhead for many years, notably with the Education and Library Committees. A magistrate and former mayor, his unique services were fittingly rewarded when the Freedom of the Borough was conferred upon him. His deep interest in the welfare of the Institute, of which he was Chairman of Governors from 1908 to 1941, is reflected in the endowment of the Solly History Prize, in his generous contributions to the fund for the building of the Pavilion (of which he laid the foundation stone), and in his gift to the School of the Memorial Tablet commemorating the Old Boys who were killed in the 1914-1918 War.

Over a long period we were compelled to use the shelters during alerts, and both staff and boys helped the war effort by acting as Wardens, Home Guards, Fire-Watchers, Billeting Officers, and A.R.P. messengers.

Lectures on life in various branches of H. M. Forces have been given to the School during this period, and have been found very interesting, particularly when delivered by Old Boys or illustrated by films.
